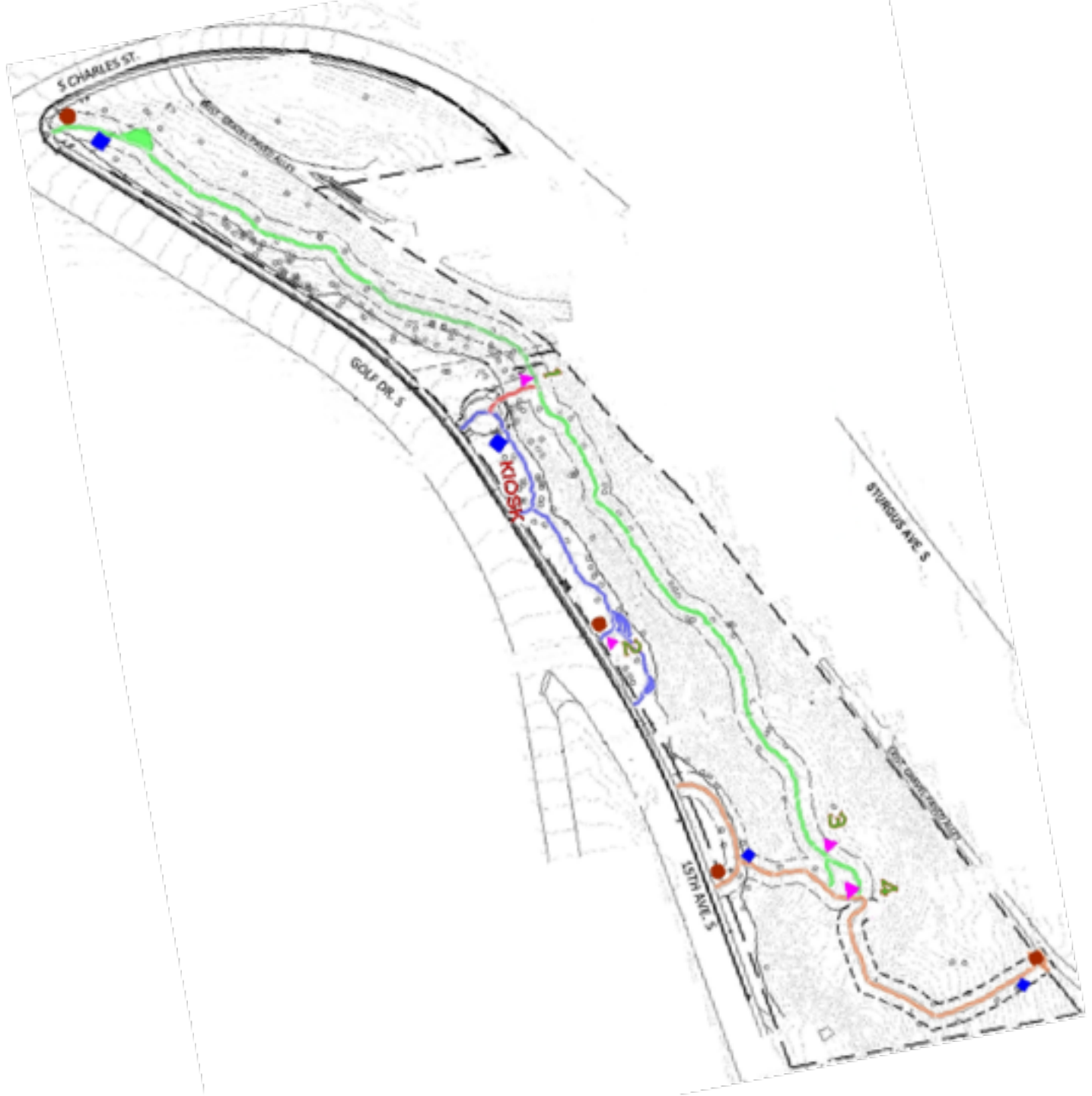


Lewis Park Site Plan

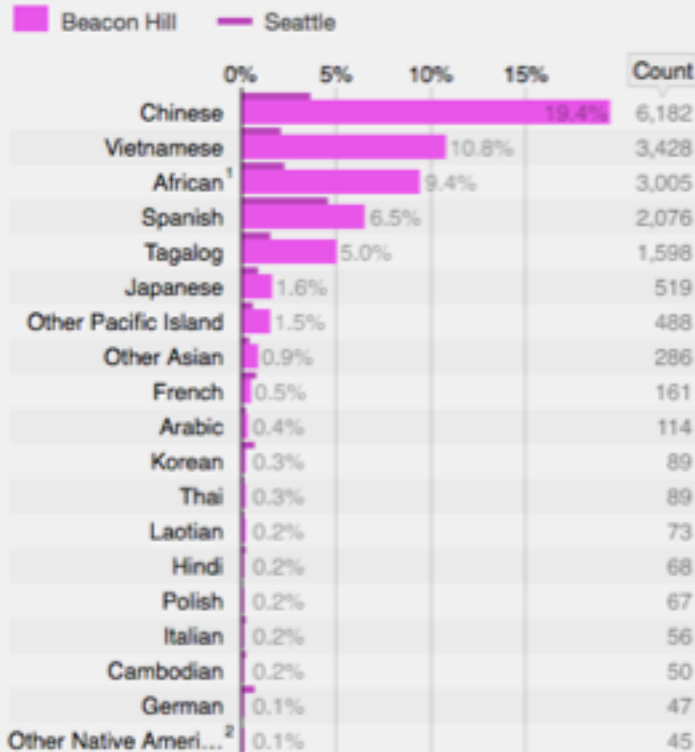
Languages in Beacon Hill, Seattle, Washington

Count number of people speaking given language at home

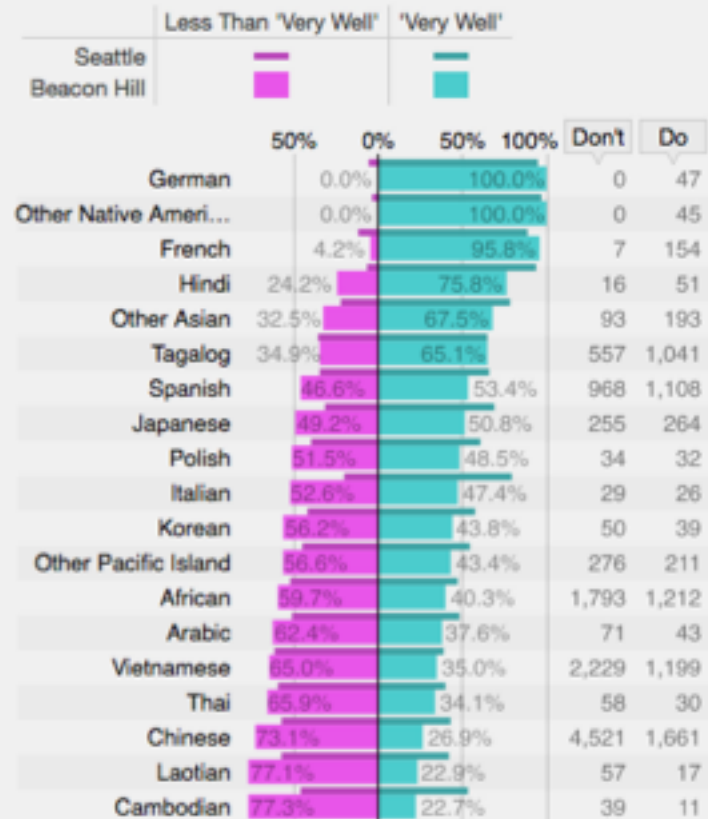

Scope: population of Seattle and Beacon Hill

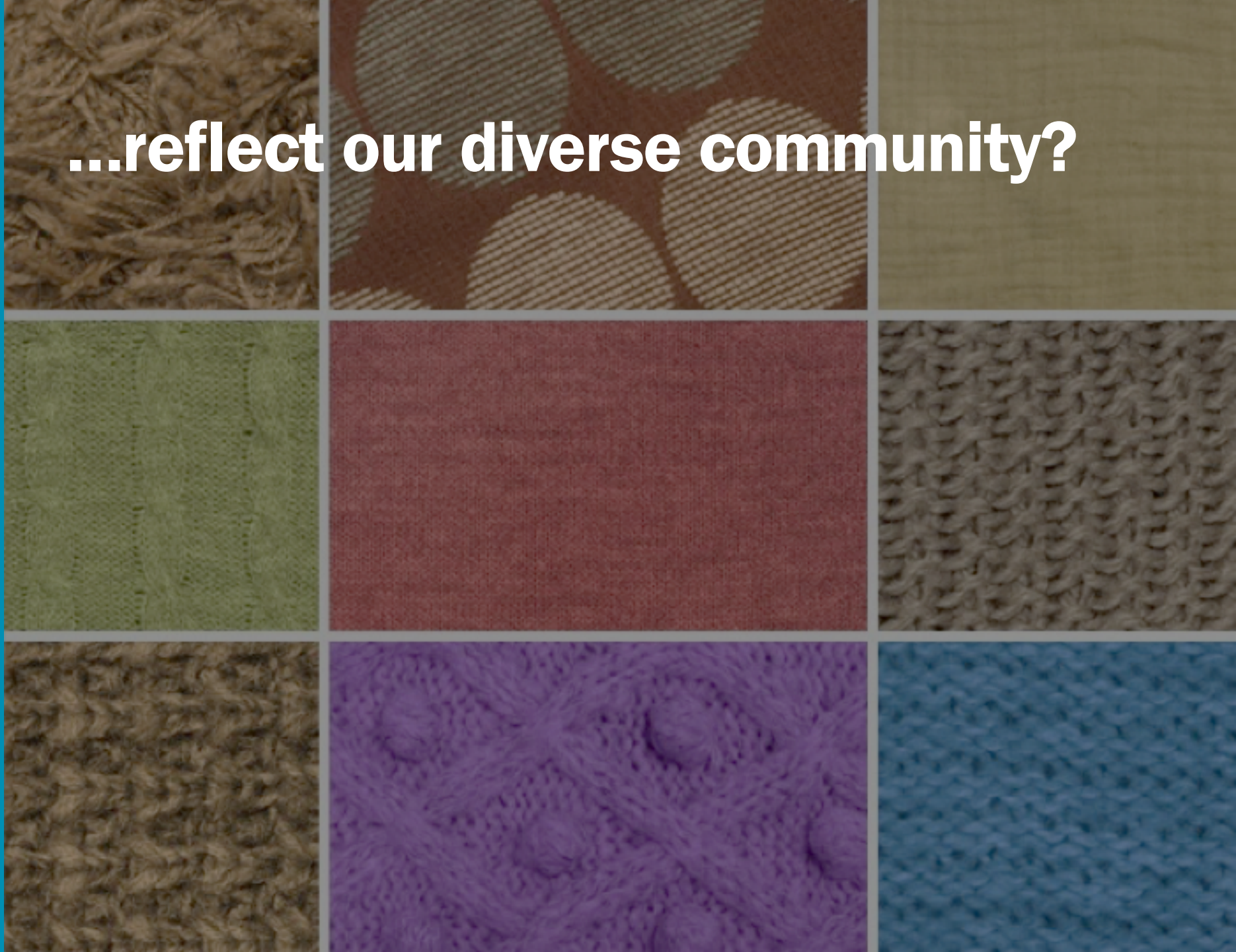


Don't number of people that don't speak English 'very well'

Duwamish Origins





The Duwamish people have been in the area since time immemorial. Known as the People of the Inside, *dx^wdəwʔabš*

Their stories, such as “North Wind, South Wind”, tell of the last Ice Age, and an Ice Weir breaking over the Duwamish River.

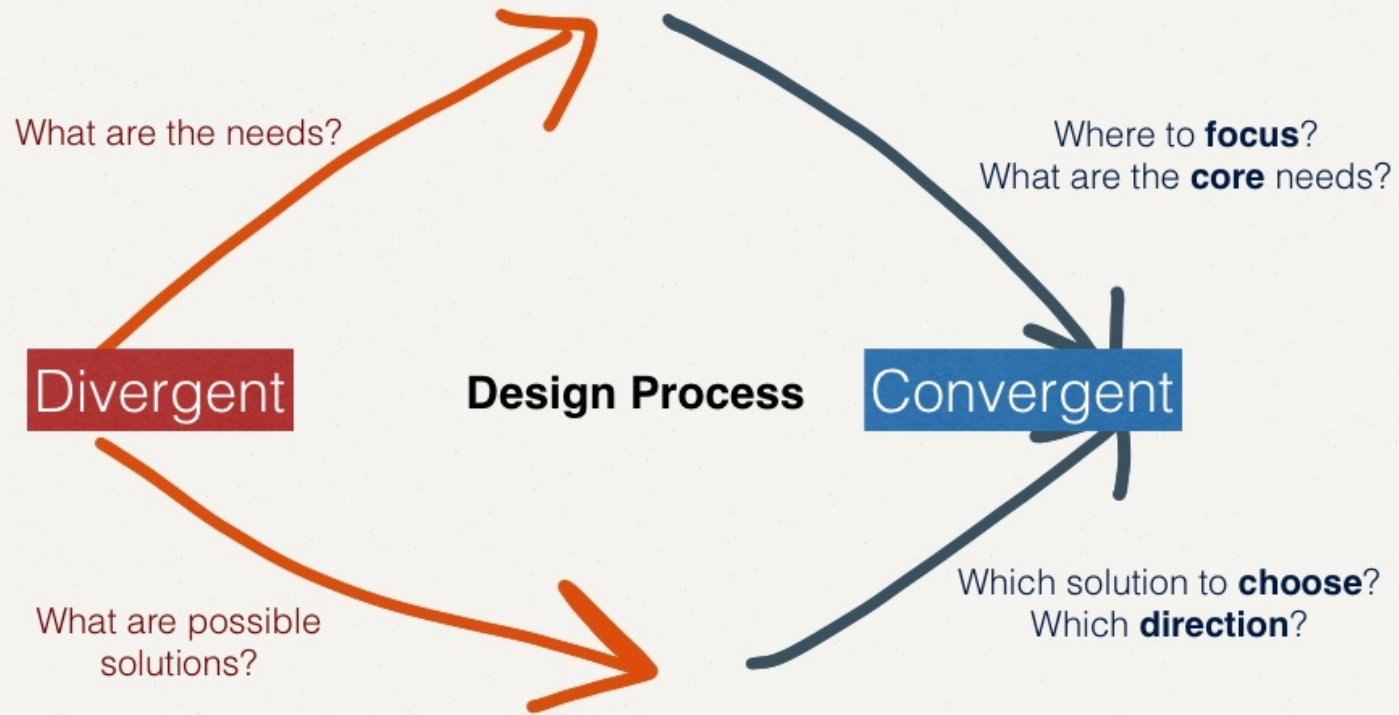
